


CTE: For Faculty, By Faculty

Formative assessments monitor student learning to provide ongoing feedback that can be used by instructors to improve their teaching and by students to improve their learning. Formative assessments are generally low stakes and provide invaluable and immediate feedback and allow midpoint adjustments.

CTE services include:

- Classroom Observation
